Service users' physical health is considered as part of their assessment and treatment, with support, advice or onward referral offered where appropriate. <ul> <li>Guidance: This includes blood pressure, heart and respiratory rates; BMI; blood tests, and Lifestyle factors (e.g. diet, exercise, smoking, drug and alcohol use).</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Communication	<ul> <li>5. The needs of service user's family members, friends or carers are considered as part of the assessment process and they are offered an assessment of their needs.</li> <li>6. Care plans are jointly developed with service users and their family member, friend or carer (if applicable), and they are given a copy with an agreed date for review.</li> </ul>

Medication	<b>7</b> . Psychotropic medication is provided in line with the relevant NICE and BNF guidance for the service user's diagnosis/condition.
Psychological Therapies	8. Psychological therapies are provided in line with relevant NICE guidance for the service user's diagnosis/condition.
Discharge	<ul> <li>9. Within 24 hours of discharge a discharge letter is sent to the service user's GP and a copy of the service user's care plan is sent to the accepting service (if applicable).</li> <li>10. The service user and their family member, friend or carer (if applicable), receives at least 24 hours' notice of discharge and this is documented.</li> <li>11. Service users discharged from an inpatient setting receive a follow-up within 48 hours of discharge.</li> <li>12. Service users have a crisis plan agreed and in place prior to discharge from an inpatient service.</li> </ul>
Outcome Measures	<b>13</b> . Assessments include the use of an appropriately validated outcome measure(s) (e.g. symptoms, level of functioning and/or disability) which are used to monitor, inform and evaluate treatment.
