Some young people struggling to cope with severe and complex mental illness, find themselves at the beginning of a lifetime journey through mental health services. To help these young patients onto the right path, the Royal College of Psychiatrists Education and Training Centre (CETC) is pleased to announce a national conference for CAMHS professionals who face the challenge of providing 'round the clock', accessible and appropriate services for young people with severe mental disorders.

Following the National CAMHS Tier Four Review, the 'Pushed into the Shadows Report' and the 2007 amendments to the 1983 Mental Health Act, urgent developments are required at the Tier Three / Four interface of Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services to ensure that these young people are provided with suitable treatment in appropriate settings when they first present in crisis.

This conference aims to bring about improvements in children and young people's inpatient care by presenting the national picture, looking at the drivers of change and sharing new ideas and best practice.
