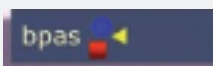

Speakers

John, Lord Alderdice, FRCPsych, is a Consultant Psychiatrist in Psychotherapy in Belfast. He is an Honorary Fellow of the Royal College of Psychiatrists. He established the Centre for Psychotherapy in Belfast and is a Visiting Professor in Psychiatry, and Joint Chairman of the Critical Incident Analysis Group, at the University of Virginia. He is also Joint Chairman of the Bahcesehir University International Dialogue Initiative based in Istanbul, and President of ARTIS (Europe). He travels widely as a lecturer and consultant in the psychology of terrorism and violent political conflict and has been recognized with various honorary degrees and awards. He was from 1987 to 1998 the Leader of Northern Ireland's cross-community Alliance Party, and played a significant role in the negotiation of the 1998 Belfast Agreement. He was the first Speaker of the new Northern Ireland Assembly from 1998 until 2004, and was then appointed one of four international monitoring commissioners tasked by the British and Irish Governments with overseeing security normalization in Northern Ireland. In 1996 he was elevated to the House of Lords at Westminster, and from 2005 to 2009 was the elected President of Liberal International, the world-wide family of liberal political parties.

Anne Alvarez, PhD, M.A.C.P., Consultant Child and Adolescent Psychotherapist, trained as a Clinical Psychologist in Canada and the USA before training as a Child and Adolescent Psychotherapist in the UK. She is a Consultant Child and Adolescent Psychotherapist (and retired Co-Convener of the Autism Service, Child and Family Dept. Tavistock Clinic, London). She is author of *Live Company: Psychotherapy with Autistic, Borderline, Deprived and Abused Children* and has edited with Susan Reid, *Autism and Personality: Findings from the Tavistock Autism Workshop*. A book in her honour, edited by Judith Edwards, entitled *Being Alive: Building on the Work of Anne Alvarez* was published in 2002. She was Visiting Professor at the San Francisco Psychoanalytic Society in November 2005.

Donald Campbell is a member, training analyst and former President of the British Psychoanalytical Society. He worked for 30 years at the Portman Clinic in London where he also served as Chairman. He

is the past Secretary General of the International Psychoanalytic Association. He has published on the subjects of suicide, violence, perversion, child sexual abuse, and adolescence.

Paola Capozzi is a Psychiatrist, Psychoanalyst, full member of the Società Psicoanalitica Italiana (SPI) and of the International Psychoanalytical Association. Since 1994 she has worked as a full time psychoanalyst in Milan. She has been Scientific Secretary of the Centro Milanese di Psicoanalisi and for ten years editor of *Quaderni Milanese di Psicoanalisi*; two of them treated the contributions on Herbert Rosenfeld and Eric Brenman and were subsequently translated into English. She published papers in the *Rivista Italiana di Psicoanalisi* and in the *International Journal of Psychoanalysis*.

Franco De Masi is a training analyst of the Italian Psychoanalytical Society and former President of Centro Milanese di Psicoanalisi and Secretary of Training Milanese Institute. He is a medical doctor and a psychiatrist who worked for twenty years in psychiatric hospitals. Now he lives and works as full time psychoanalyst in Milan. Currently his main interests are focused on the theoretical and technical psychoanalytical issues related to severely ill patients. He has published several papers in *The International Journal of Psychoanalysis* and in the *Rivista Italiana di Psicoanalisi*. He is author and editor of numerous books and in 2006 published *Vulnerabilità Alla Psicosi* (*Vulnerability to Psychosis - the English version is published by Karnac*).

Professor Rosine Jozef Perelberg is a Visiting Professor at UCL, a Training Analyst and Supervisor, Fellow of the British Psycho-Analytical Society. She gained a PhD in Social Anthropology at the London School of Economics, University of London. She co-edited with Joan Raphael-Leff *Female Experience: Four Generations of British Women Psychoanalysts on Work with Women*. She has edited *Psychoanalytic Understanding of Violence and Suicide, Dreaming and Thinking, Freud: A Modern Reader and Time and Memory*. She has written *Time, Space and Phantasy*. In 2006 she was named one of the ten women of the year by the Brazilian National Council of women.

James Gilligan, M.D. is Clinical Professor of Psychiatry at the School of Medicine, Adjunct Professor in the School of Law and Collegiate Professor in the School of Arts and Sciences at New York University, NY, USA. For over 30 years he lectured in psychiatry at Harvard Medical School and was Director at the Institute of Law and Psychiatry, McLean Hospital, Harvard Medical School and Medical Director of Prison Mental Health Programmes for the Massachusetts prisons and prison mental hospital for the “criminally insane”. In 1993 he was appointed consultant to Tony Blair, M.P., “shadow” Home Secretary, and the Law Lords of the House of Lords, Great Britain, on causes and prevention of violent crime. From 2000-2002 he was a Member of the Academic Advisory Council and Chair of the Committee on Violence Prevention in President Clinton’s National Campaign Against Youth Violence. He has been a consultant on many international bodies including the World Health Organisation, International War Crimes Tribunal, The World Economic Forum of Geneva and Davos, Switzerland, Consultant to the Secretary General of the United Nations, Kofi Annan, in the preparation of a report on the global problem of “Violence Against Children” that was presented to the General Assembly in October 2005. In 2008 he was technical psychiatric consultant and advisor to the film-director Martin Scorsese on the making of a film scheduled for release in autumn 2009, based on the history of the Massachusetts prison mental hospital for the “criminally insane” during the time it was directed by Dr. Gilligan. He is author of numerous books and articles, most recently:- “Sex, Gender and Violence,” British Journal of Psychotherapy, 25(2):239-256, May 2009 and Book Review of Offenders’ Memories of Violent Crimes, edited by Sven A. Christianson, to appear in The Howard Journal of Criminal Justice, 2009 (in press.)

Dr Carine Minne, Consultant Psychiatrist in Forensic Psychotherapy, Portman Clinic (Tavistock & Portman NHS Foundation Trust) and Broadmoor Hospital (West London Mental Health NHS Trust), Psychoanalyst, BPAS. Dr Carine Minne works as Consultant Psychiatrist in Forensic Psychotherapy in the high secure setting of Broadmoor Hospital and the out-patient setting of the Portman Clinic. She trained in forensic psychiatry and psychotherapy and became the first dually trained psychiatrist working in NHS forensic settings where she also applies

her psychoanalytic training. Her special interest is the provision of long term continuity of psychotherapy treatment with same therapist for some patients seen in high security who eventually move through medium security, low security and eventually back to the community, using the OPD tool (Operationalised Psychodynamic Diagnosis) to monitor treatment progress and outcome. She is the Training Programme Director for forensic psychotherapy training in the Portman Clinic/Three Bridges Medium Security training scheme for junior psychiatrists and she chairs the Special Interest Group in Forensic Psychotherapy at the Royal College of Psychiatrists.

Marianne Parsons is a psychoanalyst working with children, adolescents and adults. Formerly Head of Clinical Training at the Anna Freud Centre and editor of the Journal of Child Psychotherapy, she has contributed several papers to books and journals. For nearly 20 years she was Consultant Child and Adolescent Psychotherapist at the Portman Clinic, London, where she was a member of the Violence Research Group led by Mervin Glasser and developed a special interest in children and adolescents who act violently. She was also Course Director of the Portman Clinic Diploma in Forensic Psychotherapeutic Studies. She now works in private practice with adults, adolescents and children and is a Training Analyst for the British Association of Psychotherapists Child and Adolescent Psychotherapy Training. She teaches and supervises for a number of training schools, and is a visiting lecturer for psychoanalytic trainings in Finland and Florida.

Marie Zaphiriou Woods is a psychoanalyst working with children, adolescents and adults. She is a senior child psychotherapist at the Anna Freud Centre, working intensively with children and parents, and running a clinical group. She was the psychoanalytic consultant and manager of the Anna Freud Centre Nursery for 11 years and then of the Parent-Toddler Service for 9. She works privately with children, adolescents and adults, and teaches and supervises for a number of training schools. She lectures for the joint UCL-AFC MSc in Psychoanalytic Developmental Psychology, and is a training analyst and supervisor for the British Association of Psychotherapists. She is the author of published articles and book chapters.
