Formerly the founding director of the Centre for the Advancement of Children's Mental Health and Associate Director, National Institute of Mental Health (NIMH), Peter has received many national awards including the Elaine Schlosser Lewis Award for ADHD research. His main areas of interest includes assisting medical practitioners and parents to adopt evidence-based mental health assessment and treatment approaches in dealing with children who are suffering from mental disorders.

The recognition of children and young people with ADHD is increasing but there is still much that needs to be done to help improve their lives. The use of medication is increasing, new psychological interventions are being developed (especially for pre-scholars) and biological understanding is improving quickly. This conference aims to bring together these strands to chart a course for service development and show you how to implement best practice. The NICE guidelines on ADHD will be published before this conference and we intend to take up and develop its messages.
