The **British Journal of Psychiatry** is a monthly journal published by the Royal College of Psychiatrists. The journal was founded in 1853 by J.C. Bucknill. At that time, it was known as the *Asylum Journal* until 1858 when it was re-titled the *Journal of Mental Science*. In 1963, the name was changed to the now familiar **British Journal of Psychiatry**.

The **British Journal of Psychiatry** is one of the world's leading psychiatric publications. It covers all branches of the subject, with particular emphasis on the clinical aspects of each topic. In addition to a large number of authoritative papers from around the world, the journal includes literature reviews, lectures, "point of view" articles, a comprehensive book review section, and a lively and well-informed correspondence column.

Each issue of the journal includes several commissioned editorials on subjects of topical importance, intended both to inform and to provoke. A series of supplements, sent free to subscribers, provide extensive in-depth coverage of other selected areas.

The journal is essential reading for psychiatrists, clinical psychologists, and all professionals with an interest in mental health.
