Speakers:

Lorna Goldberg, M.S.W., L. C. S. W., President, ICSA, is a psychoanalyst in private practice working with children, adolescents, and adults. She has co-led a support group for ex-cult members with her husband, William, for over 30 years. Lorna also is the Dean of Faculty, Institute for Psychoanalytic Studies, Teaneck, New Jersey, where she teaches courses on child development (early development, latency, and adolescence) and on depression. She has written extensively on her clinical work with former cult members, cult-related issues of development, adolescence, and on recovered memory for social work and ICSA publications. She contributed a chapter, "Guidelines for Therapists," in *Recovery From Cults*, edited by Michael D. Langone.

William Goldberg, M.S.W., L.C.S.W., a therapist in private practice, has co-led a support group for ex-cult members with his wife, Lorna, for over 30 years. It is the oldest group of its kind. Bill has recently retired from the Rockland County (NY) Department of Mental Health, where he directed several outpatient programs serving mentally ill adults and where he was the Director of Training and Education. Mr. Goldberg is an Adjunct Instructor in the Social Work Department of Dominican College where he teaches Social Work Methods, Social Problems, and Social Deviance. Mr. Goldberg has written eleven published articles on the psychodynamics of cults and chronically mentally ill young adults. He has testified before the New York State Assembly Committee on Child Care, the New York State Social Service Committee, the New Jersey State Assembly Judiciary Committee and the Connecticut State Judiciary Committee.

Mr. Goldberg and his wife Lorna are past recipients of the Authentic Cult Awareness Network's Hall of Fame Award and the Leo J. Ryan Educational Foundation's Leo J. Ryan Award. <http://www.blgoldberg.com>



Dr. Nicola Crowley MB ChB MRCPsych., is a Consultant Psychiatrist in General Adult Psychiatry within the NHS. Prior to this she qualified in medicine from the University of Birmingham Medical School, with an interest in neuropsychiatry and complementary and alternative medicine. Subsequently she specialised in psychiatry, training with both the Royal College of Psychiatry (UK) and the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Psychiatry. Her career has included liaison psychiatry (in particular psycho-oncology and hospice liaison), psychotherapy (including group analysis and small group experiential teaching), home treatment, crisis intervention work and general adult psychiatry. She has co-written 2 book chapters "The Transpersonal Perspective" and "Pathological Spirituality" in "Spirituality & Psychiatry" Eds Cook CCH, Powell A, Sims ACP Royal College of Psychiatrists Press 2009 (In Press).

Gillie Jenkinson, M.A., is a Director of Hope Valley Counselling Limited and specialises in counselling and psychotherapy to those who have left cults or coercive relationships/groups and those who have been abused, as well as working with clients with other issues. Ms. Jenkinson is a trained Counsellor (Advanced Diploma in Pastoral Counselling) and an MA Gestalt Psychotherapy. She is accredited and registered with United Kingdom Council for Psychotherapy (UKCP) and is a member of the British Association for Counselling and Psychotherapy (MBACP). In 1999 she did a month long internship at Wellspring, Ohio and returned there in 2008. Ms. Jenkinson runs an ex-member support and education group in London. She has presented her research, "What helps Ex-cult members recover from an abusive cult experience," at a number of national and international conferences. She has published a paper in the Cultic Studies Review entitled 'An Investigation into Cult Pseudo-Personality: What Is It and How Does It Form?' in 2008.
