ABOUT THE COURSE

"Adults with a better understanding of mental illness are less likely to endorse stigma and discrimination". (Link & Cullen 1986).

It can therefore be postulated that enhancing understanding in children may prevent the development of such prejudice.

A group of senior trainees from the Public Education Committee of the Northern Ireland Division of the Royal College of Psychiatrists, in collaboration with the Queen's University of Belfast have developed a Special Study Module to enable medical students to develop and deliver their own Mental Health Workshops to school children under the guidance of senior psychiatric trainees.

This one-day course has been designed to enable senior trainees across the UK to draw upon the experience of the course co-ordinators to assist in the development of their own SSM models.

The aspiration is that enthusiastic trainees will ally themselves to a core group of other geographically close, like minded peers and take their own module to a local university.

Topics will include:

- **Establishing contact with universities**
- **Developing a module descriptor and study guide**
- **Consideration of SSM learning objectives and methods of delivery**
- **The assessment process**
- **Feedback from medical students and schools involved**
- **Sharing useful resources**
