

PSYCHOSIS AND PERSONALITY DISORDERS: DIAGNOSTIC IMPLICATIONS AND INSTITUTIONAL DYNAMICS

Dr Rob Hale is a Consultant Psychiatrist and Psychoanalyst. For the past 30 years has worked at the Portman Clinic which offers outpatient treatment to those people who have problems arising from violence or sexual deviancy. He provides consultation to secure units to establish a psychodynamic understanding of patients and the processes they stimulate in the institution and the individual staff members.

Dr Carine Minne is a Psychoanalyst and Consultant Psychiatrist in Forensic Psychotherapy at Broadmoor Hospital and the Portman Clinic. She chairs the Royal College of Psychiatrists' Special Interest Group in Forensic Psychotherapy and one of her particular interests is in providing long-term continuity of psychotherapy to patients across the different levels of security they pass through and continuing when they are back living in the community.

Presentation of theoretical perspectives and clinical evidence to support a single diagnostic entity which impacts differently on the institutional and individual level at different times. This will be based on the presenters' experience of assessing and treating people suffering from mental disorders in secure psychiatric settings and prisons. Dr Bob Hale and Dr Carine Minne will refer to the need for consultations to professional teams due to the contagious effect of mental disorders on staff, clinical and managerial.

Individuals with a Personality Disorder present challenges to those charged with their care in the health and judicial systems. The development of appropriate treatment services is now a key priority, as detailed in the Northern Ireland Personality Disorder Strategy. The strategy proposes a framework for the development of specialist services for people with a personality disorder, and covers both Mental Health and Forensic Services.

Who Should Attend? The course is aimed at a multidisciplinary audience, including doctors, psychotherapists, psychologists, nurses and social workers working in the acute, community and specialist sectors and those working in prison and probation services.

Course Structure: The morning of lectures will be followed by specialist workshops in the afternoon, with further group feedback and discussion.
