9.00-12.30	<p style="text-align: center;">WORKSHOP A Neuroimaging Workshop for the Royal College of Psychiatrists</p> <p>This half day workshop is designed for consultant Old Age Psychiatrists and trainees to inform them about current imaging methods used for the assessment and diagnosis of dementia. It will focus on clinically applicable methods, enabling participants to better understand what different scan changes occur in different dementias and what scan to order when for someone with suspected dementia. With the many advances in technology, it is important for old age psychiatrists to be well informed as to the usefulness of these diagnostic measures. This programme will educate participants about the main imaging modalities and how to apply them in clinical practice. The workshop is highly interactive.</p> <p>Facilitators: Professor John O'Brien (Newcastle), an old age psychiatrist with clinical and research interests in the application of neuroimaging to diagnosis of dementia. Dr Paul Kemp (Southampton), an experienced nuclear medicine physician with substantial clinical and research experience in the reporting of scans for people with dementia.</p> <p>Who should attend: It is recommended for old age psychiatrists, neurologists, geriatricians, primary care physicians with an interest in the elderly, and other dementia specialists as well as trainees in these areas.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">WORKSHOP B People with dementia and challenging behaviour</p> <p>A half day workshop on the principles and practice of a clinical approach using a bio-psycho-social model</p> <p>The aims of this workshop are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To give a conceptual framework for understanding behaviours and formulating psychosocial interventions To use experiential work to provide key learning To provide practical guidelines in setting up and running a service <p>Background: Newcastle Older Peoples Mental Health Services have developed a Challenging Behaviour Team (CBT) since 1999 and are part of Northumberland Tyne and Wear NHS Trust. The service has been extensively evaluated and shown to have a positive impact on quality of life for people with dementia, a reduction in stress for formal carers and a reduction in psychotropic prescriptions and admissions to in patient facilities. The team has helped other centres across the country (for example, London, Edinburgh, Bolton and Northern Ireland) to set up and develop their own services. The team has recently been awarded – Dementia Team of the Year Award in 2009 and was a finalist in the Nursing Times Team of the Year, 2008.</p> <p>Facilitators: Dr Ian James, Consultant Clinical Psychologist, Head of Challenging Behaviour Service Lorna MacKenzie, Challenging Behaviour Nurse Clinical Lead Terri Smith, Challenging Behaviour Nurse Clinical Lead Dr Alan Swann, Consultant Old Age Psychiatrist, Organic Care Stream Lead</p> <p>Who should attend: all clinicians with an interest in this area.
