MANAGING PHYSICAL HEALTH OF PEOPLE WITH SERIOUS MENTAL ILLNESS IN AN INPATIENT SETTING

QUESTION is St Pancras Hospital meeting national guidelines¹ for physical health monitoring in patients with serious mental illness (SMI), in terms of ECG, blood test and weight monitoring?

CONCLUSIONS Screening is not currently being completed fully and reasons behind this are inadequate. Further work must be done to improve physical health screening to prevent this health inequality.

POPULATION

In total, 76 patients were included (M=35, F=41).

The majority of patients (n=62) had an ICD 10 F20-29 diagnosis.


All but two patients in the hospital were on at least one anti-psychotic





LOCATION

A central London hospital with 6 psychiatric wards (one psychiatric intensive care unit, three acute wards and two rehabilitation wards).



KEY POINTS

- There is excess mortality in patients with SMI, and poor physical health contributes to this²
- The inpatient setting is an important location for investigation and health promotion
