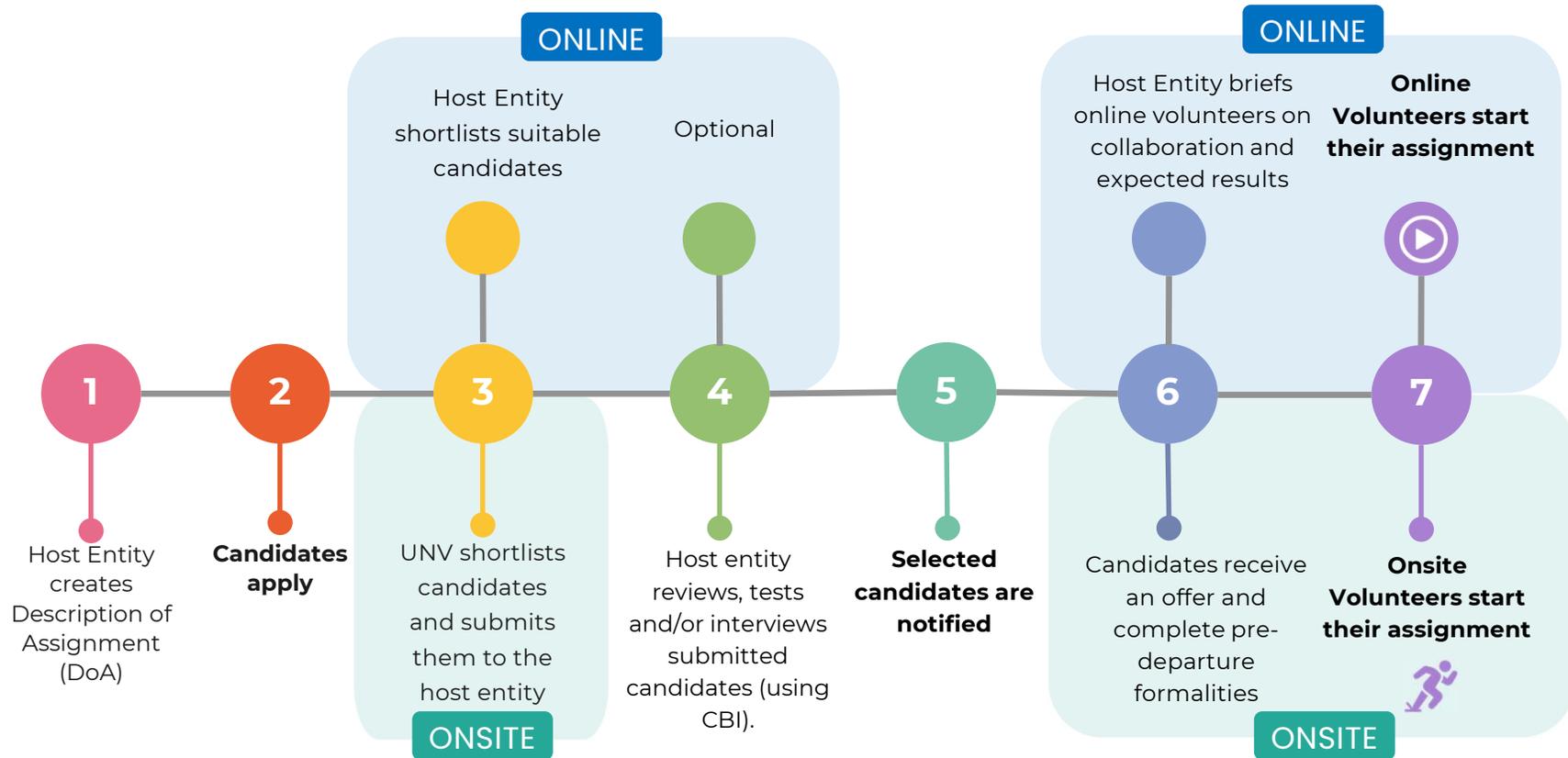

Technical Clearances for UNV Health Volunteers



Critical Incident Stress Management Unit (CISMU)

The United Nations Department of Safety and Security (UNDSS) Critical Incident Stress Management Unit (CISMU) is the central authority responsible for the effective and timely coordination and delivery of psychosocial services.

- Conduct clearance processes for UNV **mental health support** roles.
- Manage pre-submission clearance procedures.



The Division of Healthcare Management and Occupational Safety and Health (DHMOSH)

DHMOSH provides health-related services in New York and in over 100 locations worldwide. It provides medical evacuations and preparedness for public health emergencies.

- Conduct clearance processes for UNV **medical professionals** in UN Missions.
- Manage post-submission clearance procedures.

In the heart of the humanitarian crisis in Afghanistan, they contribute to safeguarding the health of more than 3,000 UN personnel striving for peace and development.

Volunteers on the screen

Task: Development of a screening tool for developmental disorders among children and teenagers in emergency settings



The Global Child Protection Area of Responsibility (led by UNICEF) sought the support of an online volunteer to carry out a desk study and summarize existing documents aimed at assisting children, families, and educators in identifying and supporting children with neurodevelopmental disorders in humanitarian settings.

The online volunteer, alongside other professionals and colleagues, participated in the development of a tool designed to help family members and caregivers identify children and teenagers affected by developmental disorders in the absence of specialist support.

This collaborative effort involved linking with other relevant professionals and key informants, adding significant value and knowledge to the development of this tool.
