SYSTEM LEADERSHIP

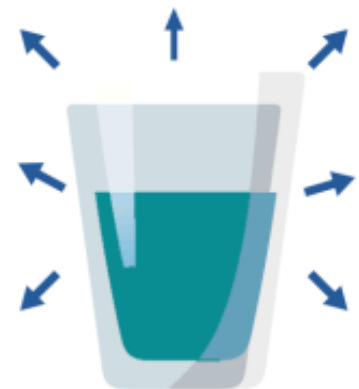
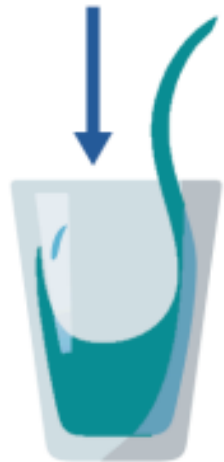
The importance of integrated care has been emphasised in all healthcare systems across the UK.

Local Projects

Lead a service improvement/service design/re-design/evaluation or get involved in larger projects

Projects must be agreed collaboratively and be of strategic or operational significance

Projects may not progress as planned – this remains a valuable opportunity with emphasis on learning

Learning

- Project progression is not an assessed criteria
- Emphasis on learning through reflection

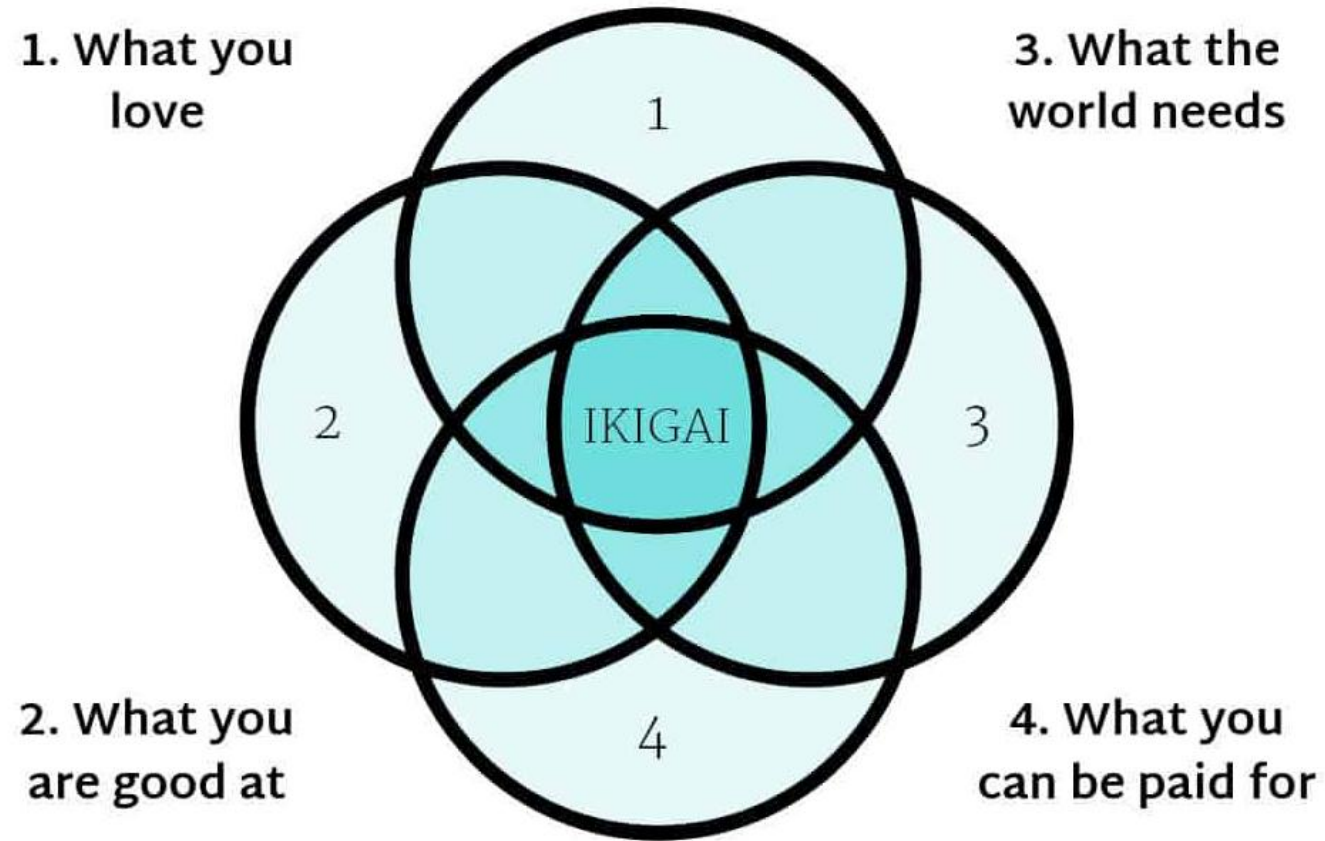

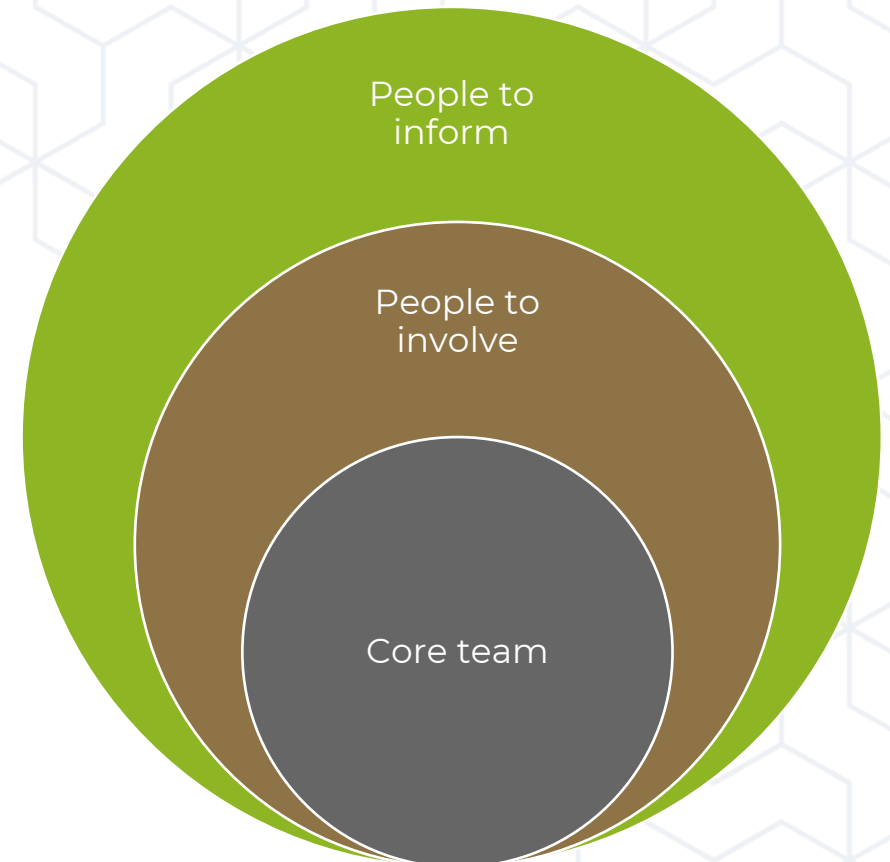

Example projects from previous cohorts

Service design

- Setting up an rTMS service in a Trust
- Piloting primary care perinatal mental health clinics

Involvement in Trust level/regional level projects

- Developing clinician dashboard
- Midlands Charter in enhancing wellbeing of Junior Doctors

Audit followed by an improvement project to address gaps-

- initial clinical audit on the quality of health and social needs assessment
- advancing the outcome of this audit to link into a Trust wide Quality improvement collaborative.

Project ideas

- Is this something that interests me?
- Is this a quality priority for my organisation?
- What is the problem you are trying to address?
- Why is it a problem?
- What are you trying to achieve? (SMART goal)
- Whom do you need?
- How will you measure impact?

Project pitches

- Elevator pitches- 3 minute video
- To develop skills in making an audio-visual pitch to present your idea in a succinct manner
- To help you distil your project plan
- To learn and reflect on other projects
- Submit your project summary (c200 words) and project pitch videos to lmfs@rcpsych.ac.uk by 11am, 17 September
- 4 breakout rooms- 10 fellows in each room

Project pitches

- After each recorded project pitch there will be a 5-minute Q&A and discussion.
- Brief written feedback will be provided by the facilitators based on both your presentation and engagement in Q&A following other fellows' presentations.
