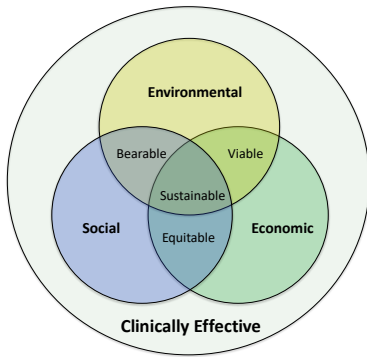

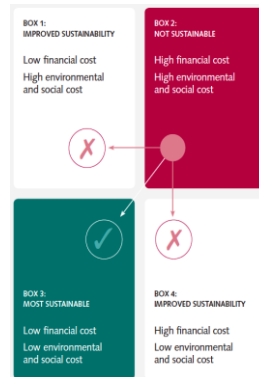
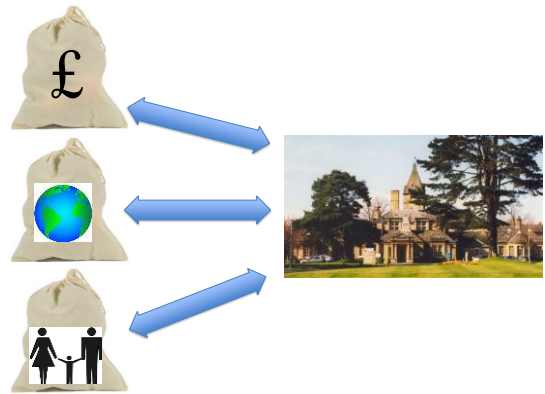


What is Sustainability?

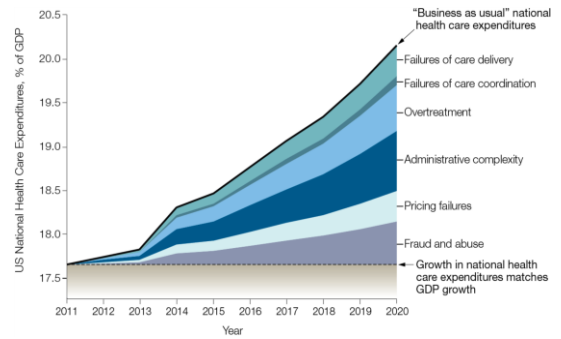
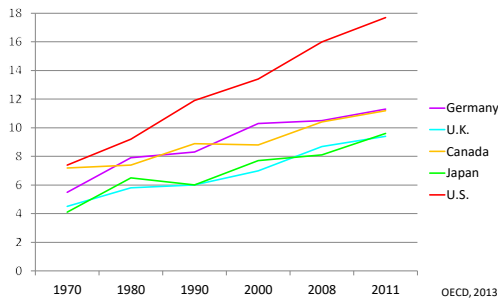
Economic sustainability

Societal level

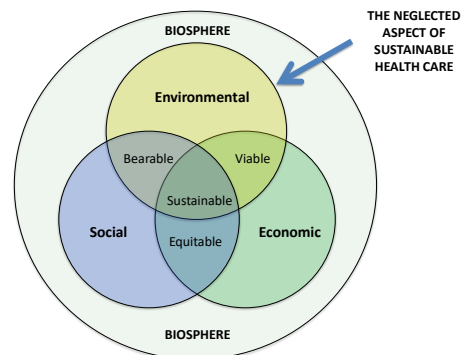
- Ensuring social acceptability of mental health services and interventions

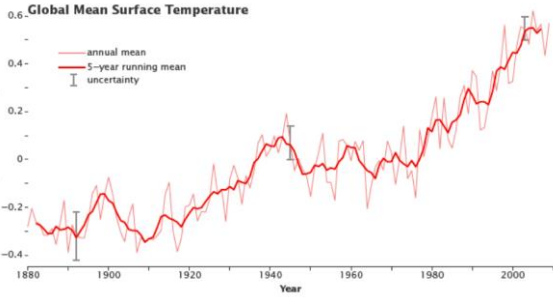
Community level:

- Ensuring that there is adequate social resource to run services - staff

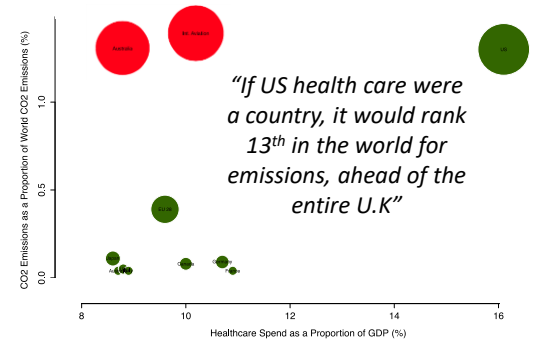
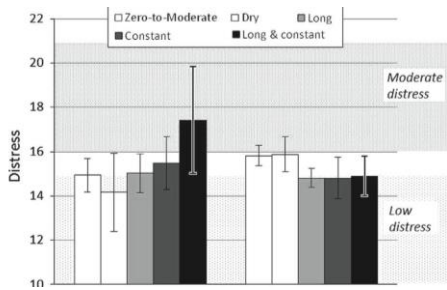




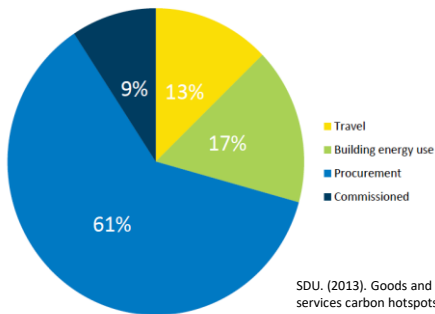
Climate change and mental health

- The WHO and the Lancet Commission state that climate change is the largest threat to human health in the 21st Century
 - Increased prevalence of mental disorder after natural disaster
 - Reduced provision for those with pre-existing mental illness
 - Effects of heat on mental health & mentally ill
 - Increased infectious disease outbreaks

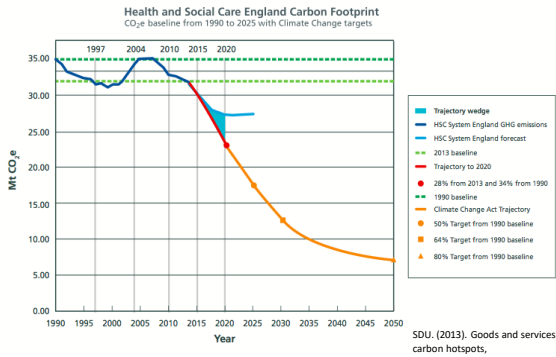
The effects of drought



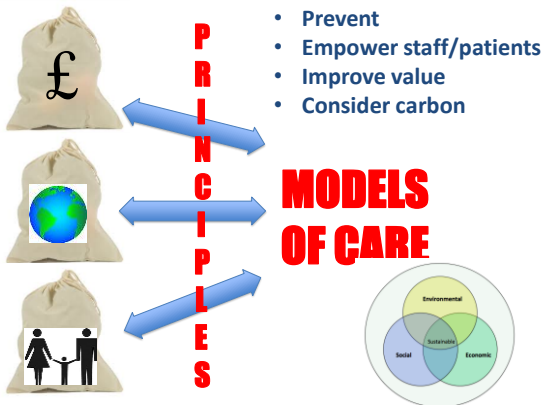
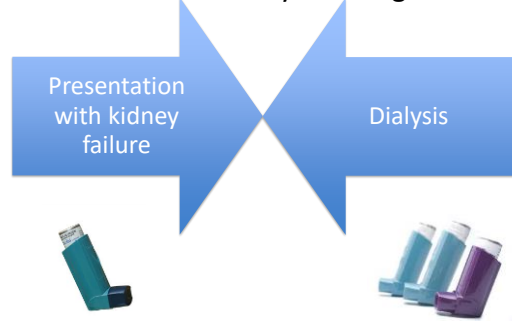
NHS carbon footprint breakdown 2012

Sustainability in CCQI

- The standards promote sustainability
- We have mapped sustainability principles onto criteria in each CCQI standard
- Accredited services that meet 90% of the mapped criteria are presented with a Sustainability Commendation

Examples

Criteria	Sustainability Principle
The memory service provides education on the prevention of dementia within the local community	Prevention
People with dementia attend and contribute to local and service level meetings and committees	Empowering service users and carers
Front-line staff members are involved in key decisions about the service provided	Staff Empowerment
People with dementia are offered evidence based pharmacological and psychological interventions and any exceptions are documented in the case notes	Improving Value
Everyone is able to access the service using public transport or transport provided by the service	Consider Carbon
