Our TC Programme has 69 spaces and consists of two phases and is spread over 6- or 12-months dependent upon sentence length. We are a national prison programme and as such take referrals from across the prison estate. We are hierarchical in structure and every resident has a job within the community, alongside this structure we run our Recovery Through Nature Animal Therapy Programme giving residents the opportunity to work outside the unit and to care for animals as therapy. Groupwork and peer support groups are ran daily with every resident has their own dedicated keyworker throughout their treatment journey.

Avalon is a 40 bed therapeutic community in the forensic setting of HMP Dovegate. The community run a mixture of slow , open psychotherapy groups , large community meetings , thoughts and feelings check ins and Art psychotherapy groups. Residents are also encouraged to invest in the principles which underline the TC such as democratisation, culture of enquiry and learning through shared experiences.

<b>Description:</b>	<p>Camelot, which is one of the six therapeutic community wings at HMP Dovegate. Although we are separated from the main side of the prison, we still share healthcare and the multi-faith centre with the main population. We do have a separate education department, visits, induction unit and grounds. We are a forty-bed unit which consists of those in core therapy (minimum of eighteen months) and those that are in their assessment phase (twelve weeks) that have moved over from the TC induction unit. Our unit consists of seven prison custody officers and six clinical members of staff. Meetings are held on the unit where all staff and participants are expected to attend.</p> <p>Every week day we hold a thoughts and feelings meeting, which involves the whole community. In addition to this, community meetings are held on Mondays and Fridays which again involve the whole community and small groups are held on a Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. Small groups consist of ten residents and are facilitated by either one or two staff. Art Psychotherapy are additional an additional that anyone can join and are held once a week. We also hold a voluntary resettlement meeting on Fridays, which anyone is able to attend when needed. We also hold a celebration day once a month in which the community spend informal time together, have a meal with each other and celebrate achievements such as community members coming into their ending of therapy. We also have animal assisted therapy that regularly attends the unit.</p>

Treatment consists of group therapy and structured community living where members have shared responsibility for the day to day running of the community, decision making and problem solving. TC+, as with all Democratic TCs in prisons, centre on addressing risk factors and offending behaviour needs that inevitably emerge in this environment. TC+ places a greater emphasis on structural interventions targeting specific learning skills. Learning and information is displayed in written or pictorial form around the unit.</p> <p>Gartree TC+ is a 12-bed unit and accepts category B and life sentenced or IPP prisoners only. The TC+ at HMP Gartree does not accept prisoners with an index sexual offence. The TC+ at HMP Gartree is a co-commissioned unit HMPPS/NHS England and has a multidisciplinary staff team consisting of a therapy manager, forensic psychologist, LD specialist, speech and language therapist, occupational health therapist, art and drama therapists, two non-uniform group facilitators, six uniformed facilitators, half a custodial manager (the top half!) and an administrator.</p>

We deliver a core treatment model suitable for sentenced offenders with a wide range of offending needs whose complex needs cannot be adequately met by a single intervention. We run community meetings on Monday and Friday, and small group therapy meetings which run for an hour and a half on Tuesday Wednesday and Thursday. Our provision includes Art Therapy, Music therapy and Psychodrama. We have a good educational department and gym, and run Family Day every year when family is invited onto the wing for the day. We have 20 beds and a staff team trained in working with this client-base.

It is a unique approach to therapy, focusing on change through communal living and relational experiences. The evidence-based program is guided by values, standards and practices which create an environment promoting healthy relationships, managing difficult behaviours, taking responsibility and risk reduction.</p> <p>DTC members engage as a community to reflect upon themselves and the reasons behind their offending behaviour. Ultimately, the goal of spending time at a DTC is to help members live life positively, free from the risks which lead to offending behaviour. The DTC aims to help members recognise patterns of behaviour in an honest, open and supportive environment.</p>

Individuals must have a minimum of 24 months left to serve on their sentence, be motivated to address their risk, take responsibility for their offending history, have insight into the areas of their risk they need to address, be of category C status, be adjudication free (at least 3 months) and drug free (at least two months). Applicants should also be free of self-harm for 2 months (longer stability may be required for those with long history of self-harm) and have no active symptoms of major mental illness. Individuals should also not have an index sexual offence or outstanding treatment needs related to sexual offending. Those with historical sexual offences will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Referrals for the TC should be made to tcwarrenhill@justice.gov.uk. Applicants will be required to complete a referral pack which can be sourced from the Warren Hill TC mailbox.</p> <p>Applicants will need to be aware that the TC is an open-ended intervention where progress is reviewed on a six monthly basis. There is a minimum of 4-6 months in assessment and a minimum of 18 months in core therapy. Applicants progress will be reviewed every 6 months and they will be expected to work with the TC treatment team to identify a suitable end date to therapy as they progress and address their risk.</p>
